Most noncredit certificate programs are not eligible for federal financial aid. The WTA tuition assistance program bridges the gap for low-income students pursuing short-term training.








WORKFORCE TRAINING ACADEMY: District Wide Tuition Assistance Program for Short-Term Training






NARROWING THE DIVIDE **DIGITAL LITERACY**

Each course is designed to meet individuals where they are as they advance to learning more skills with each milestone achieved. RE-ENTRY | PARTNERSHIP

The Evelyn K. Davis Center is proud to be a partner of CIRCA, a community re-entry program: CIRCA (Central Iowa Returning Citizens Achieve), for a variety of reasons. Formerly incarcerated individuals face a wide array of barriers that may inhibit a smooth transition back into the community. The aim is to help remove barriers that returning citizens face so they may achieve employment, career and financial goals. Through our partnership with CIRCA, the Center has provided classes at the Iowa Correctional Institute for Women (ICIW), the Newton Correctional Facility and for the staff at all facilities recognized as an important place for individuals to visit as they embark on their journey back into the community and reestablish their lives.



DMACC YOUTHBUILD | SERVING YOUTH-THE FUTURE OF TOMORROW

DMACC YouthBuild is a comprehensive community-based preapprenticeship program that provides job training, counseling, and educational opportunities for youth ages 18–24 who had previously dropped out of high school. Because the program is comprehensive in its approach, DMACC YouthBuild is a number of things all at once: Alternative High School, Community College, Community Service Program, Job Training and Pre-Apprenticeship Program, Leadership Development Program, Youth Development Program, Life Skill and Personal Development Program, and Long-Term Mini-Community.

DMACC YouthBuild simultaneously addresses several core issues facing low-income communities: education, housing, job, and leadership development. Partner organizations include Habitat for Humanity, HyVee, the Evelyn K Davis Center, IowaWORKS (WIOA), Children and Families of Iowa (WIOA), and the Home Builder's Institute.



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IOWA OPPORTUNITY PASSPORT | INCREASING FINANCIAL EDUCATION

This program is a financial education and matched savings program that helps youths make a successful transition to adulthood.

Opportunity Passport® has been designed by the national Jim Casey Youth Opportunities Initiative, specifically for young people ages 14 to 26 who have been in foster care. The program provides an on-ramp to mainstream banking and \$1-for-\$1 matching funds to participants when they use their savings toward approved assets such as housing costs, expenses for college or trade school, or to acquire transportation."

HOMEWORK HELP FOR YOUTH | TUTOR HEROES

For 7th–12th grade students who are committed to improving their academic skills during the year, this program provides asisstance in a wide variety of subjects. Community volunteers assist with algebra, creative writing, government and speech writing. Also offered is free ACT Prep Workshop, offered in both fall and spring.







YOUTH EMPLOYMENT | Y-EXCL

The Summer Youth Experience Program is just that: an experience. While the overarching goal is to strengthen and develop workplace skills through employment, it is vital that participants, ages 14–21, also explore future academic endeavors. For two weeks, students participate in campus tours and activities at various schools such as DMACC Ankeny, Simpson College, Grand View University, University of Northern Iowa and Iowa State University.

Additional activities include hiking and canoeing and a one-of-a-kind scavenger hunt at the State Historical Building.
